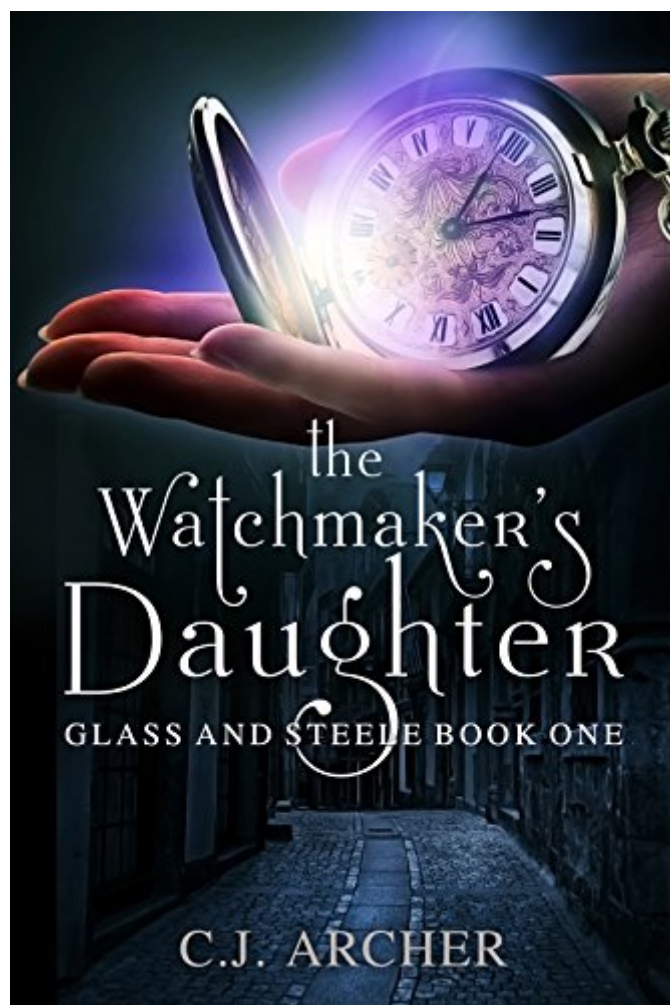

CJ Archer is one of my absolute favourite authors, and I was lucky enough to get my hands on an advanced copy of *The Watchmaker's Daughter*, book 1 in the Glass and Steele series. The fantasy is subtle, but it is present throughout the book. The historical setting isn't in-your-face, but it suits the book perfectly.
