

Synopsis

Los seÃ±ores del narco es una descarnada crÃ³nica sobre las alarmantes complicidades de los altos cÃ¡rculos polÃ¡ticos, policiales, militares y empresariales con el crimen organizado. Tras echar abajo el mito de la fuga de El Chapo de la prisÃ³n de Puente Grande en un carrito de lavanderÃ­a, este libro narra su ascenso en la jerarquÃ¡a del crimen y cÃÂmo ha llevado hasta sus Ãºltimas y terribles consecuencias un "pacto de impunidad" con numerosos funcionarios pÃ³blicos y hombres de negocios. I agree with other reviewers who said that the author uses a lot of names without precisely stating who these individuals are. There is also another problem where she presents compelling information without developing the significance of what she has just stated. Lastly, I feel that if a person does not comprehend a lot of Mexican political culture, this book becomes extra difficult to read. For example, not every Spanish language reader knows what Los Pinos is. This book is worthy of five stars I cannot get passed the horrible writing.

I had great expectation for this book since I saw the interview that Anthony Bourdain did on his show in Mexico with the Author. However, the book is very poorly written. From the get go, the Author starts giving names of people and more people, government officials, police, military officers,

and drug smugglers in an effort to denounce corruption in Mexico, but it is too much too quick. I am not Mexican, but I am fluent in Spanish, and I don't know who are the people mentioned in this book. The author does not set the book like a novel building characters, but just details crimes, arrests, interviews of people who she obviously is familiar, but the average non Mexican reader has no clue who they are. The excess of names make the book lack continuity and plot, it is just a compilation of facts, people, and places. It is too bad, I wish the author would have written a more traditional format in which at least you build up characters and follow a congruent story line without the need to name every corrupt official in Mexico. By the time I got to the third chapter, I was completely lost with all the names mentioned and the only thing I got was that El Chapo had been captured, then escaped, and that he had given a declaration implicating several politicians who later threaten him and got him to re-cant his story and made the report disappear.

Great journalism work, compiled and well narrated in order to avoid making it that boring. Too many names at times but it gives you a better sense of truth on the investigation behind. It illustrates quite clearly all the corruption and dirty complicity of all levels of the government. How hard it must be to escape those networks and the unfortunate ramifications in all of our society. I'd recommend this book to anyone interested in getting a sense of the durg world and its relation to the government in Mexico.
