

This volume contains four of the many plays by Ibsen, four that are well-known and liked: The Doll House, The Wild Duck, Hedda Gabler, and The Master builder. The Doll House: The critic H. L. Mencken described Henrik Ibsenâ ™s plays as â œobvious thoughts in sound plays. â • There is â œnothing mysterious in them; there is not even anything new in them. â • Ibsen offered reality. He was not interested in presenting â œmorals, lesson, symbols and that sort of thing. â • Yet, â œhe hit upon an action that was all suspense and all emotion. â • Mencken quotes Ibsen: â œWhat I wanted to do was to depict human beings, human emotions, and human destinies, upon groundwork of certain of the social conditions and principles of the present day. â • Many people may agree with

Menckenâ ™s assessment of Ibsen. However, others would contend that besides presenting reality, Ibsen also portrayed proper behavior. This can be seen in A Dollâ ™s House. It is realistic and relevant, but it also shows how the society of Ibsenâ ™s time mistreated women. The play presents a husband and a wife. The wife is a â œdoll,â • beautiful, unsophisticated, childlike, well-meaning, but ignorant of the adult world and affairs because women were not educated. All of her friends see her as a doll. Her husband treats her as one, calling her childish names. He tries to control all of her behavior, not because he is mean, but because he loves her and he thinks she is unable to make decisions. He tells her what to eat so that her teeth will not be spoiled from sugar and how much she should spend because she does not understand much about money. And it is the latter, the money, that gets her into trouble. Her husband was sick some years back and needed to travel and stay in a warmer climate for some months, but the couple had no money.
