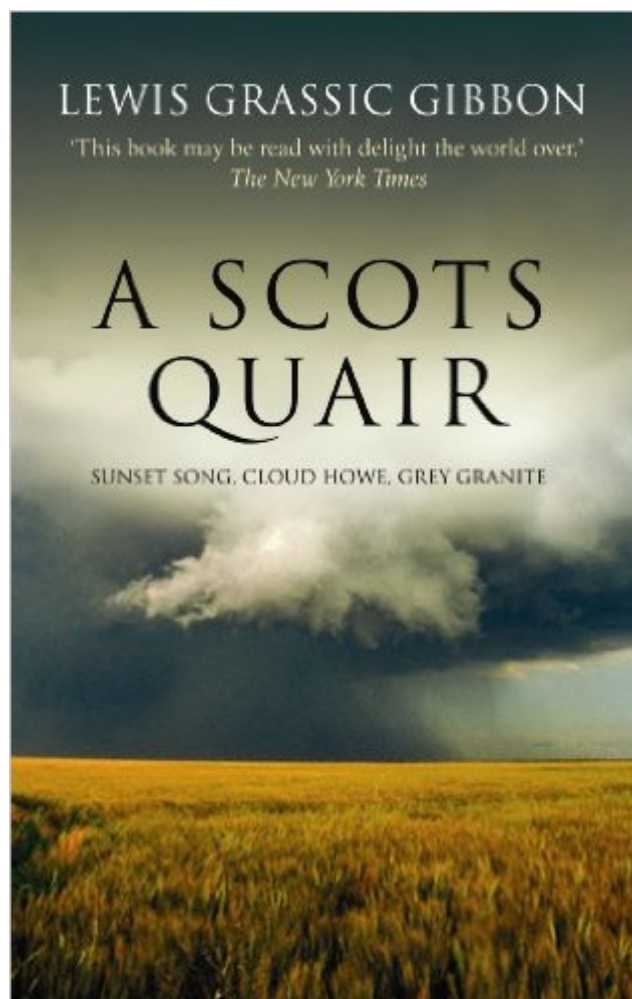

Following one character through all the changes works well as the socio-economic and religious changes register clearly in her life. He's a writer of dozens of books about Scotland.
