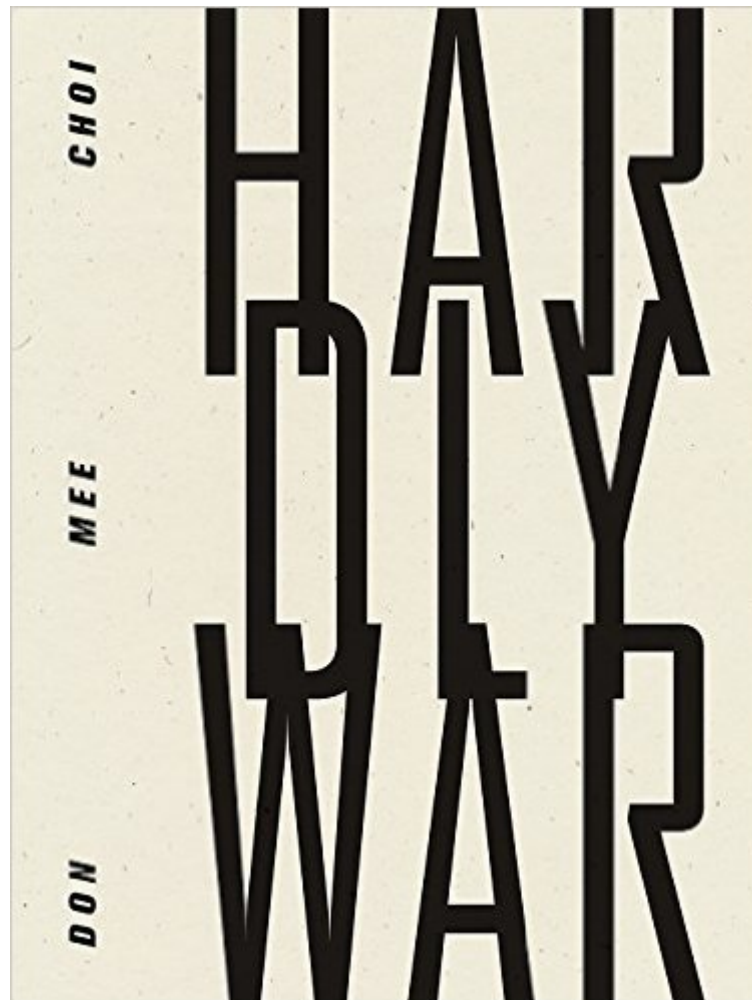

## Synopsis

Hardly War, Don Mee Choi's major second collection, defies history, national identity, and militarism. Using artifacts from Choi's father, a professional photographer during the Korean and Vietnam wars, she combines memoir, image, and opera to explore her paternal relationship and heritage. The title of Seattle poet Don Mee Choi's second book, *Hardly War*, is a curious combination of words that seems innocuous enough if you're, say, skimming spines on a bookshelf. But if you give it two seconds' thought, those two words obviously belong nowhere near each other. War is

a binary; youâ™re either at war or youâ™re not. There are no small wars, or halfway wars, or hardly wars. If you go to war and a bullet splinters your skull, there is never a moment when you are semi-dead. The lights are on or off; some words have no dimmer switch. Constructed from poems, chunks of prose, sheet music, photographs, collage, and even the script for an (incredibly short) opera, *Hardly War* is unlike anything youâ™ve ever seen. As excellent as Choiâ™s debut poetry collection *The Morning News Is Exciting* was, *Hardly War* has taken an evolutionary leap of a generation or six beyond its predecessor. Choi assembled the book around documents from her fatherâ™s career as a photographer in the Korean and Vietnam wars. Stitched together like this, it could be shuffled from one bookstore section to the next, never quite finding its home: biography, anthropology, theater, history, poetry.
